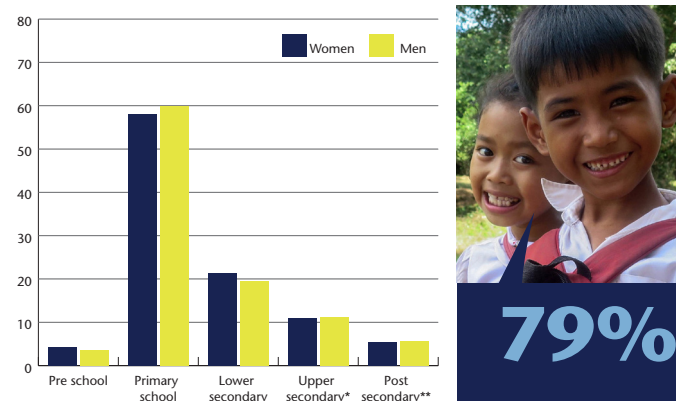




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Person who are currently attending school by education level and sex, 2016

Employed population aged 15–64 years by industrial sector, 2016

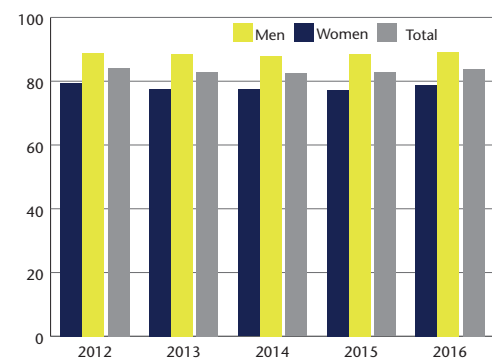

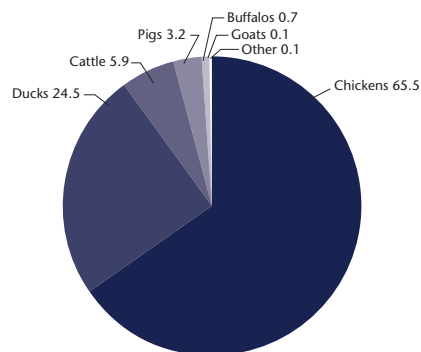
Total rice production by season, 2016

In this folder, the results from the Cambodia Socio-Economic Survey (CSES) 2016 are presented. It provides important information about living conditions in Cambodia 2016, covering the main socio-economic areas such as health, education, housing conditions, economic activities, victimization, vulnerability etc. The CSES 2016 was conducted from January – December 2016 and was done from a sample of 3 840 households.

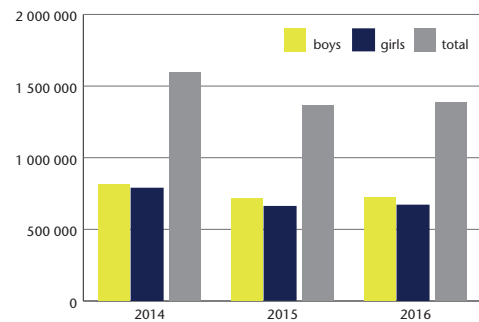

The composition of the total income of a population group refers to the relative share of each income source or group of sources, expressed as a percentage of the aggregate total income of that group or area. In 2011, self-employment income accounted for 58.5% of the total income while only 38.4% from wage and salary among Cambodians. Earnings from those income cover 48.7% of the total income in 2015 by the CSES Report. Families. Close to 50% of Cambodians earned income through employment in the later years. 2016 the self-employment rate was 44.9 and wage and salary 48.7.

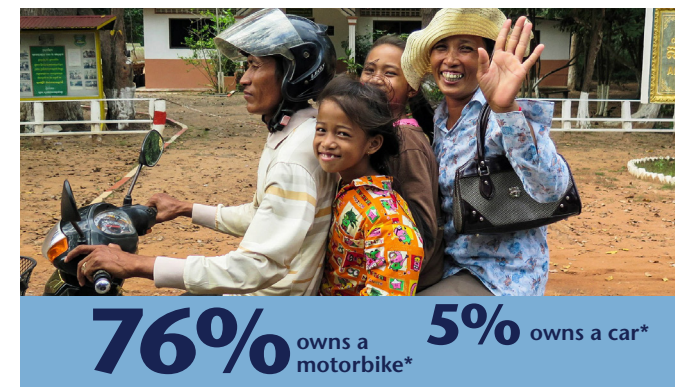

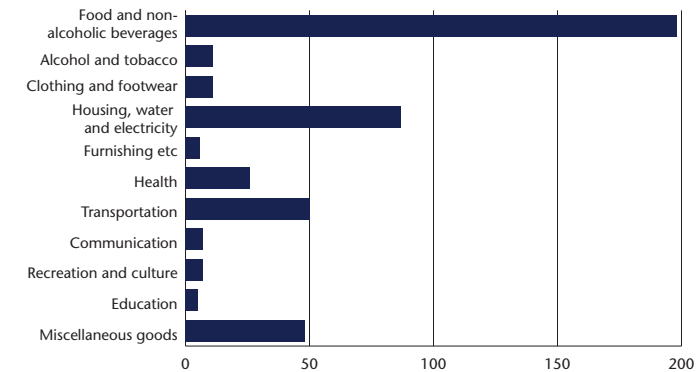
